

Literacy

- Reading My Father's Dragon and identifying plot, character, setting, and making predictions; monitor comprehension with think alouds, identify new vocabulary and define it as used in the story
- Use digraphs: ar, er, ng, ai, ou, ea, igh, ch in reading and writing
- O Comparing different types of fiction to non-fiction
- Select words that use schwa sound such as: the, a in "balloon"
- Explain why some words that end in s, I, and f double their last consonant
- Identify and compose prepositions, verbs, adjectives, and nouns
- Independently and in small groups, students will continue to read books at or just above their reading level with a teacher to practice reading strategies
- Use illustrations, speech bubbles, or sentences to create a complete story with a clear beginning middle, and end
- Students will use non-fiction texts to communicate information about their country to a reader
- Students will explain, identify, and use nouns, prepositions, verbs and adjectives in their writing and the writing of others
- Students will compose imaginative fiction stories using story elements
 modeled from our read alouds

Social Studies

This is My Father's World Unit:

- (a) Identify and label the 7 continents and 5 oceans
- List and describe key geographical features of the seven continents of Earth
