

#### Literacy

- Reading My Father's Dragon and identifying plot, character, setting, and making predictions; monitor comprehension with think alouds, identify new vocabulary and define it as used in the story
- Use digraphs: ar, er, ng, ai, ou, ea, igh, ch in reading and writing
- © Comparing different types of fiction to non-fiction
- Select words that use schwa sound such as: the, a in "balloon"
- $\odot$  Explain why some words that end in s, I, and f double their last consonant
- © Identify and compose prepositions, verbs, adjectives, and nouns
- Independently and in small groups, students will continue to read books at or just above their reading level with a teacher to practice reading strategies
- Use illustrations, speech bubbles, or sentences to create a complete story
  with a clear beginning middle, and end
- Students will use non-fiction texts to communicate information about their country to a reader
  - Students will explain, identify, and use nouns, prepositions, verbs and adjectives in their writing and the writing of others
  - Students will compose imaginative fiction stories using story elements modeled from our read alouds

Math

### Social Studies

This is My Father's World Unit:

- Identify and label the 7 continents and 5 oceans 0
- List and describe key geographical features of the  $\odot$ seven continents of Earth
- Make connections between cultures, traditions,  $\odot$ geography, language, religion, climate, and animal life within the 7 continents and how God designed each continent for a specific purpose
- This month our focus will be Australia, North  $\odot$ America, South America, and Europe.
- Students will participate in an independent research  $\odot$ project on the country of their choosing and teach about their findings to their classmates.

### Force Olympics Unit:

- Introduce and differentiate between a push  $\odot$ and a pull on the direction of an object
- Determine, through guided inquiry, that heavier  $\odot$ objects and faster objects give a stronger push

Science:

- Using ramps, and simple machines to test the  $\odot$ relationship of "push" and "speed"
- Building Simple Machines (ramp, pulley,  $\odot$ catapult, wedge, etc) and the nature of friction and force at play with each
